Commendations for Hope Church

Recommendations for Hope Church

Proverbs 3:5-6 – ⁵ *Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;* ⁶ *in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.*

1) I pastorally recommend you seek to assess how much culture is impacting your ability to imitate Christ.

2) I pastorally recommend you take stock of your love of money, generosity, and financial ministry.

Sunday Text Questions
1 Thessalonians 1:2-3 and Proverbs 3:5-6
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Read the text aloud and discuss any significant observations or issues that need clarification together.

- 1) Most New Testament Letters have a section where the apostle commends (praises) and recommends (exhorts) the Christians to whom he ministers. What are your thoughts on one of your pastors giving you commendations and recommendations?
- 2) How does Paul commend the Thessalonian Christians in 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3? What things does he commend them for, and how is that a helpful example for your pastors to model toward you?
- 3) How has the ministry at Hope Church blessed you? Can you think of any examples where you have seen your brothers and sisters serving with faithfulness and compassion?
- 4) How should we understand the statement from Proverbs 3:6, “in all your ways submit to him [God],” and what does the application of that statement look like in the life of the Christian?
- 5) How would you assess the ways our culture and our consumption affect Christians today, including you? What, if anything, do you think you should do about it?
- 6) How can a Christian, both the rich and the poor, know if they have an inappropriate love of money, and what might their symptoms look like?
- 7) How is giving to the Lord, to his church, and the work of his Kingdom, a financial ministry to which every Christian has been called? Why is this important for your own soul?
