Ephesians 1:3-10

Read the text aloud and discuss any significant observations or issues that need clarification together.

- 1) Except for God, what things in this world make you feel blessed, giving you great joy and satisfaction?

- 2) Paul says God “predestined us” and “chose us in him before the creation of the world” (vv. 4-5). Why is that significant, and what makes so many Christians uncomfortable with the doctrine of election?

- 3) How is it possible that you can remember willfully choosing God and yet God can claim that he chose you before you even existed? How can both be true?

- 4) Paul teaches us that our redemption and forgiveness through Christ and our adoption as children of God is a present blessing for the Christian (vv. 5-7). How do those things bless your present life?

- 5) How does the fact that God will right all wrongs and redeem all of creation give you a hopeful blessing for the future (vv. 8-10)? How does such hope comfort you when you suffer?

- 6) How is a Christian more #blessed than any other person on the earth? Spend some time in prayer thanking God “every spiritual blessing” (v. 3) he has given to you.

- 7) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
