Thomas said to Him, "Lord, we don't know where you're going. So how can we know the way?"



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. FROM PASTOR KRITZER:

"For some time now you've been praying for me, Connie and our family as we've been considering our calls to Bethany and Peace Camarillo.

Admittedly this process has taken awhile and we truly thank you for those prayers, words of affirmation and encouragement! They are part of the means through which the Lord has convinced us that our time at Bethany (and our sister sites of The Gathering and Holy Cross) is not yet finished; so we've returned the call to Peace and will be remaining here.

I want to assure you that the vitality, import and future direction of this ministry was never in question! Bethany is a blessed place through which He blesses as we Gather, Connect and are Sent.

Peace Lutheran and Camarillo however hold special places in our hearts too. Connie graduated HS in Camarillo, her parents still live there and we've often wondered if it might be a retirement location for us. Furthermore, Peace is a ministry through which family members have confirmed their faith and we ourselves began our lives as husband and wife. So we naturally wrestled with the question of what was God arranging?

We've become convinced that He was doing an Epiphany work of revealing to us that our ministry here at Bethany, The Gathering and Holy Cross, is not over!

I realize that with two calls in short order some of you might wonder if another call might be around the corner. While any congregation can extend a call to any rostered worker at any time, I call tell you that 99.5% of the time it begins with an inquiry which asks, "if you were to receive a call could you prayerfully consider it?" Most of the time if you ask a church worker to pray they will say, "of course." I can assure you that from here on out should such an inquiry come I will be saying "No!"

I've made a 5 year commitment to the leadership and staff of Bethany, to see us through the merger process, our multi-site ministry realities, our governance and structure changes that we as a congregation identified as necessary quite some time ago, that are now obligated to do as three constituted congregations become one, to guide the process of the addition of staff to serve this ministry and finally to formulate the plan for transition of pastoral leadership as a long term Senior pastorate, mine, (over next 5 years) draws to a close. Bethany's leaders have, in turn, made this same 5 year commitment.

We've not yet completed our journey together and as a multisite congregation and community of faith that seeks to Gather, Connect and Send for generations to come from our downtown Long Beach ministry (The Gathering), to our Cypress site (Holy Cross) and our main campus at Clark and Arbor, we've got a future into which we head convinced that He blesses at Bethany."
