Pastor Darrin's Report

- Four-year anniversary with Community of Grace, very thankful and blessed. Celebrating the staff and council.
- Pastor Darrin and Michelle shared highlights from the vision trip to the Dominican Republic. They met with two Haitian pastors and one Dominican pastor, visited their local neighborhoods, and learned about the ministry that is being done, as well as the challenges being faced. They also visited a medical mission with MOH, and stayed at the Mission of Hope campus in Jarabacoa where they were able to meet the staff.
