Sabbatical 2023 Send-Off Litany

<u>Kim Maple</u>: Throughout holy scripture, ministries undertaken by God's servants are periodically set aside for rest and restoration. God has given us, God's people, the Sabbath pattern of regular rest and renewal as a way of helping remind us of whose we are and what we are called to do.

<u>Scott Woolridge</u>: In that spirit, sabbaticals are gifts given to the entire congregation. The called pastor is offered a chance to step away and explore quiet places and pursue reflection. Similarly, it is an opportunity for other leaders to step forward and share their gifts with the faith community.

In the Christian tradition the laying-on of hands is believed to communicate the presence, power and promises of God. In the Book of Acts we read how the apostles laid hands on those called to a special purpose. The laying-on of hands is also a reminder of the connection of all things through the Holy Spirit. This ritual is done at special times when these gifts from God are most especially desired. At this time we call on all elders present to come forward and gather around Michael and place hands on his head and shoulders. We also invite everyone to participate.

<u>Jeannie Backes</u>: Let us pray: Almighty God, may the hands we lay on Michael convey our love and prayers that he may commune with you, O God, and find what you have already prepared for him to receive. And may the hands we lay one another communicate our promise to be present to one another in a spirit of grace and kindness and love.

<u>People</u>: With joy and gratitude, we send out our pastor in his sabbatical journey. We know that neither time nor distance could ever separate us in the One Holy Spirit. As he goes, we pray God's blessing on him; his family; and all that he will experience. And we look forward to reuniting with him upon his return, and traveling the new path God holds out for us. In your holy name we pray, amen.

<u>Michael</u>: I receive your blessings with a grateful heart. I similarly pray that God's provision and protection be with you. And I look forward to what God has in store for all of us when I return.
