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# Why Ashes?

"... You are dust, and to dust you shall return." (Gen. 3:19)

The ashes we wear on Ash Wednesday remind us that we are sinners before God. God wants us to love and trust only God. But to sin is to turn away from God's love and trust, which reduces us to ashes.

Ashes remind us that we owe our existence to God
but like Adam and Eve we prefer to make our own rules.

Ashes remind us that God wants what's best for us
but like Jonah we prefer to trust ourselves & pursue our own wants.

Ashes remind us that God is our God and we are God's people,
but like Abraham and Sarah, we sometimes doubt God's promises.

Ashes remind us that we can be "All In" with God on days,
but turn & run away from God when things are difficult.

But ashes are also used to make soap, which cleanses us. Ashes remind us of God's cleansing forgiveness as well. God promises us raise us up from the dust and ashes of our human frailty and brokenness to abundant life. We don't wear ashes on Ash Wednesday because we've been especially sinful today. Rather, we wear ashes as a reminder that that as we were created from the dust, so shall our bodies return to the dust; and that without God's love sacrificed for us in Jesus Christ, there would be no salvation.
