## Illustration of the Hardening of Pharaoh's Heart

Yahweh removes the restraints (aka – the speed limit) thus allowing Pharaoh to continue doing what he truly longs to do (rebel against God) regardless of the costs. Another way of saying this is God "gave him over" to the evil desires of his heart (Romans 1).

### Life Group Questions:

- 1) Remember to open your life group with a time to "preach" to each other.
- 2) What aspect of tonight's lesson was new, challenging, confusing, or convicting to you?
- 3) What's the boldest or most courageous thing you've ever done for your faith? How did people respond?
- 4) The plagues were not random—they had purpose. Which of these purposes stands out most to you and why?
