Life Group Questions: Exodus 6–7:13

- 1. Share a truth about God from this passage that your soul needs to hear this week. Speak it out loud to the group.
- 2. What aspect of this teaching was new, challenging, confusing, or convicting to you? Was it something about Yahweh's identity? Pharaoh's hardness? The parallels to Christ?
- 3. Review Application Point #1: *Know This God* (Yahweh: the covenant-keeping Redeemer who hears, remembers, rescues, and refuses rivals.)
 - When you think about God, what tends to shape your view more, your feelings or His story? Why?
 - Which attribute of Yahweh in this text (hearing the oppressed, remembering promises, redeeming with an outstretched arm, opposing false gods) most expands your vision of Him?
 - What rival "gods" today (cultural, political, spiritual, personal) subtly compete for the place that only Yahweh deserves in your life?
- 4. Review Application Point #2 : *Trust This God When Rival Powers Look Bigger* (Pharaoh looked unbeatable; the magicians could imitate signs; Egypt looked permanent.)
 - Where in your life do the "Egypts" of our age feel overwhelming or unstoppable?
 - How does the Exodus challenge the way we view modern powers, political, ideological, cultural, spiritual?
 - What difference would it make this week if you really believed Yahweh is not nervous about the things that make you anxious?
- 5. Review Application Point #3 : *Tremble Before This God & Refuse the Path of Hardness*. (Pharaoh hardened his heart... then God hardened it further.)
 - What does "hardness of heart" look like in ordinary, everyday choices, not just in dramatic rebellion?
 - Why is hidden compromise often more spiritually dangerous than outward sin?
 - Is there any area where you sense the Spirit nudging you but you've been resisting?

- 6. Review Application Point #4 : Rest in the Greater Exodus Through Christ (Jesus as the ultimate Passover Lamb; cross & resurrection as the true Red Sea.)
 - Which aspect of the "Greater Exodus" is most encouraging to you: freedom from sin, new identity, the Spirit dwelling in you, or the promise of new creation?
 - How would your week look different if you lived as someone who has *already* passed from slavery to freedom?
 - What does it mean for you personally that "not one word" of God's promises will fail?
