II. Summary statement for the evening:


The word of the <u>evil one</u>, challenges the word of <u>God</u>, which introduces sin & conflict met by a word of judgment & promise.

III. The consequences of their disobedience

- 1) Loss of Relationships: With God / With One Another / With Ourselves / With Creation
- 2) Loss of Rule: This becomes evident as they lose control of the ground. Before it submissively grew abundant plants for them, but now, in rebellion, the ground only yields thorns and thistles to its "so-called master," Adam. Adam has lost the rule and now another has become the ruler, the god of this age, the prince of the power of the air (2 Cor 4:4; Eph 2:2).

Protoevangelium - Genesis 3:15

I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

IV. The first salvation


Summary of 3:19-21

God's response in v 21 to Adam's statement

Genesis 3:21

The Lord God made garments from skin for Adam and his wife, and clothed them.

- 6) Which of the four final takeaways was most impactful to you? How can practically apply that takeaway in the form of a SMART goal in your life?
