- What is the reason Peter is reminding his readers who they are? (hint...second half of the verse).

   can be thought of as a Christian's mission statement a filter to
  help us live "on purpose."
  - o What would your life's mission statement be?

  - o In what ways can you give?
  - o Have you ever gone on a mission trip? Would you like to?
