Sermon Notes

The MIGHT of a Widow's MITE Mark 12:41-44 Pastor Jeff Hinds

- 1. God is not only concerned that we give (stewardship) but also "how" (Greek <u>pos</u>) we give (Mark 12:41 NAS, KJV). God is not impressed with financial gifts given for show or to gain recognition or influence. God is impressed with humble, "never for public recognition" type giving (Matthew 6:1–2).
- 2. God "watches" (<u>etheorei</u>) our giving (Mark 12:41). This is a strong word and means "to gaze at." God, apparently, is not only watching the sacrifice we make but also the attitude from which we give (joyfully? grudgingly? generously? pridefully?).
- 3. God is pleased when our giving is sacrificial and, as already noted, with the right attitudes and motives (Mark 12:41–44; 2 Samuel 24:18–25).
- 4. God promises to reward His people for faithful (right motives, attitudes, and gifts) giving. Sometimes He rewards temporarily (here on earth), always eternally (in Heaven), and sometimes both (Mark 9:41). Our God is a gracious God.
- God sees the heart in giving, over and above the amount. A
 widow gave one-fourth of a penny (in today's currency), but
 Jesus credited her sacrifice (and heart) as greater than any gift
 given that day (Mark 12:41–44).
