Overlooking the Ascension

Lesson 1 • Acts 1:9-11

Have you wondered about the following or been asked these questions by others?

"He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty."

The Apostles Creed

How does Jesus going up to heaven impact what is going down on earth?

What Is the Ascension?

The Ascension of Christ is the resurrected Jesus **GOING UP** from earth into heaven to be exalted in glory over all!

The resurrection is His **powerful triumph** from death to life, but the ascension is His **glorious TRANSITION** from earth into heaven.

The ascension is the **HINGE** from the lowest point of His **earthly humiliation** to the highest point of His **heavenly exaltation**.

Luke, 24:50-53; Acts 1:9-11

Look <u>UP</u> to the ascended Christ and be empowered to live <u>OUT</u> His message and mission by His Spirit according to His Father's will.

Why Is the Ascension So Overlooked?

1. The Bible Seems to Say LITTLE About It.

- The narrative covers only 7 verses.
- Raises all sorts of QUESTIONS, doesn't it?
- But the Ascension is FORESHADOWED in the OT and FULFILLED in the NT!

2. The Ascension Seems Like a BAD Plan.

- The ascension begs the question begs the question: "WHY DID JESUS HAVE TO LEAVE?"
- Wouldn't it be better for Jesus to remain here on earth with us?

Premise 1 Being with Jesus bodily in the New Creation is the best end goal.

Premise 2 Jesus is no longer with us bodily on earth.

Conclusion: It would have been better if Jesus had not left!

3. The Ascension's IMPLICATIONS Are Unclear.

Why Did Jesus Have to Leave?

- "You rose, so let's hold on to this moment forever!" John 20:16-17
- "You rose, so let's get 'er done!" Acts 1:6-9
- > "What difference is You leaving us going make?" John 14:1-5, 18

4. The Ascension Is an UNUSUAL Event.

5. The Ascension Is Often ASSUMED in the Bible!

How Does the Ascension Fit into the Gospel?

- Big Picture for the Promised Messiah is revealed in TWO STAGES. Isaiah 52:13-53:12; Philippians 2:5-11
 - Humiliation: From Incarnation to Crucifixion.
 - Exaltation: From Resurrection to the Revelation = Consummation!

The Ascension Is the **BRIDGE** Between His Humiliation on Earth and His Exaltation in Heaven Preparing for His Revelation on Earth at the Second Coming!
