Questions God Asks: How Will You Respond?

Lesson One • Genesis 3:6-15

Where Are You?

The Value of God's Questions

The questions God asks are for His GLORY and our GOOD; God's questions challenge what we believe and how we behave!

The Hiding Reflex

Adam and Eve HEARD the sound of the LORD God and then tried to HIDE from the presence of the LORD God.

But the Lord God called out, "Where are you?" (Genesis 3:6-9)

God's Question: "Where are you?"

1. This Question EXPOSES Our Hiding Reflex!

What Drives Us to Hide?

Our hiding is motivated by FEAR and SHAME resulting from our sin (v. 10-11).

Two Primary Ways We Hide

- We hide through AVOIDANCE (v. 8).
- We hide by shifting BLAME (v. 12-13).

2. This Question REVEALS God's Searching Heart!

When We Sin and Hide

- God graciously SEEKS us to draw us out of hiding in our sin (v. 8-10).
- God graciously CONFRONTS us to give us opportunity to confess our sin (v. 11-13).
- God graciously RECONCILES us through forgiveness of sin in the gospel of Jesus Christ (v. 14-15).

Question Remains: "Where are you?"

Are you HIDING in fear and shame because of sin in your life?

God is seeking you to save you from the judgment your sin deserves through the forgiveness of sins in Jesus Christ.

*For He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.
Colossians 1:13-14*

*We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.
2 Corinthians 5:20-21*

COMMUNION

Remembering God's Grace in Jesus on the Cross

Followers of Jesus Christ (those who trust Christ for salvation, identify with Christ in baptism, and commit to Christ's body in membership of a local church of like faith and practice) are invited to participate in Communion located at the four tables in the auditorium. **After you take the bread and cup back to your seat, PLEASE WAIT so we may eat and drink together.** The bread and juice represent the body and blood of Jesus when He died on the Cross and reminds us who our Lord is, what He has done for us, is doing for us, and will yet do for us when He returns. Come, Lord Jesus, come!
