The Man Who Betrayed Jesus

Judas serves as a <u>MIRROR</u> in which we should look into our own souls to see whether we are true believers in Jesus Christ.

Tragedy of Regret or Half-Hearted Repentance

- > Judas <u>RETURNED</u> the money, but you can't undo your own sin (*Mt. 27:1-3*).
- > Judas <u>CONFESSED</u> his sin to the priests, but only Jesus can forgive your sins (Mt. 27:4).
- Judas <u>HANGED</u> himself in despair, instead of taking his sin to Jesus in repentance (*Mt. 27:5*).

Where Is Judas today?

The man who kissed the "door of heaven" is in <u>HELL</u>. Though Judas was a close follower of Jesus, he was never a true believer in Jesus (*Acts 1:25; Jn.* 6:70-71; 7:12).

Judas, the Man Who Betrayed Jesus

1. Judas Sought to Betray Jesus for MONEY!

Motivated by Greed

- > Judas was a <u>THIEF</u>, stealing from the money bag he was entrusted with (Jn. 12:6).
- Judas was beset by the <u>LOVE</u> of money, opening the door to Satan's influence (*Mt. 26:14-16; Lk. 22:3; Jn. 13:27*).

Solemn Reminder

The life of Judas reminds us that it is possible to be a friend of Jesus and even follow Jesus, and still not be a true <u>BELIEVER</u> in Jesus.

Serious Warning

The tragedy of Judas warns us to <u>GUARD</u> our hearts, lest we open the door to Satan's influence and betray the Lord.

2. Judas Betrayed Jesus with a KISS!

Kiss of Death

Jesus was betrayed unto death by someone He LOVED (Mt. 26:47-50; Lk. 22:48).

3. Judas Was Consumed with <u>REGRET</u>!
