Main Point of This Section and Perhaps the Entire Sermon Letter

In Jesus we ALREADY have such a High Priest in heaven with His better ministry! (8:1-2)

The HEAVENLY Ministry of the Son Who Sits as Our High Priest! (8:1-5)

The Son Sits as Our High Priest

- Because He is our PRIEST-KING, so He reigns eternally. (v. 1)
- ➤ Because He is our **PERFECT SACRIFICE**, so He *rests* eternally. (v. 1; 10:11-13)

The Son Sits to Serve as Our High Priest

- He serves in the <u>TRUE TABERNACLE</u>, so His ministry is heavenly. (vv. 2-5)
 - 1. This tabernacle is the <u>HEAVENLY</u> one The Lord Himself set up this tabernacle not men! "in the sanctuary and in the true tabernacle"

Do these words refer to heaven as the tabernacle or is there a tabernacle in heaven?

- 2. This tabernacle is the $\overline{\textbf{TRUE}}$ one Not an earthly copy, temporary shadow, or man-made type!
- 3. This tabernacle is a **LITERAL** one Not merely abstract for heaven!
- 4. This tabernacle is a **GLORIOUS** one Jesus enters in glory to present Himself as the sufficient sacrifice! (vv. 3-4)

His sacrifice was **ACCOMPLISHED** on earth and is now **APPLIED** to worshippers from heaven!

5. This tabernacle had a God-given **PATTERN** that was an earthly copy, temporary shadow, and man-made type. (v. 5)

"This 'pattern' was something visible and not simply the verbal instructions of Exodus 25-30. It may have been a 'model', for which the verbal directions were a commentary, or even God's heavenly dwelling place which Moses was permitted to see...The point of the quotation is to show from Scripture itself that the tabernacle of Moses, and by implication the whole Old Testament [priestly system] was only a copy of a heavenly reality." — Peter O'Brien (Hebrews, PNTC, 291. Emphasis mine)

"The point of all this for the present verse is that this broad conceptual context suggests that the author may indeed be thinking that Moses was shown an actual heavenly structure of which the earthly counterpart was to be a "shadow." Jewish apocalyptic, the conceptual context in which the author appears most at home, often seemed to envisage some kind of structure in heaven. Nevertheless...our author, while he may think that Moses copied from a heavenly structure, is especially focused on the heavenly presence of God in which our high priest Jesus brings His atoning ministry to its climax." – Doug Moo (Hebrews, 279. Emphasis mine,)

2. The <u>BETTER</u> Ministry of the Son Who Serves as Our High Priest! (8:6)

This true heavenly tabernacle is **NOW** being served by a *better Mediator* with a *better ministry* according to a *better covenant* based upon *better promises!* (v. 6)

The Book of Hebrews: Continuity with Discontinuity and the Superiority of Fulfillment with Escalation!

Continuity with Discontinuity: Don't settle for a <u>LESSER</u> priestly ministry on earth. (8:3-5)

"Some members of the congregation from a Jewish background may have thought that there was something defective about their Christian faith because it offered 'no elaborate ceremony in an earthly sanctuary.' For our author, however, this simply emphasized the dignity of Jesus' high-priestly ministry: 'a priesthood exercised in any earthly shrine is far inferior to that heavenly high priesthood which depends for its exercise on a perfect sacrifice offered once for all and consequent admission to the sanctuary above.' – Peter O'Brien (Hebrews PNTC, 290, referencing F. F. Bruce, Hebrews, 183). Emphasis mine.)

Superiority of Fulfillment with Escalation: Hold fast to Jesus' <u>BETTER</u> priestly ministry in heaven. (8:6)

One question arising from Hebrews 8 is concerns the relationship of heavenly ministry to earthly worship. Christian interpreters have generally agreed that Christ's ministry is shown to make Levitical practice obsolete (Heb 8:13) without ending earthly worship altogether (cf. Heb 10:24-25; 13:10-17). Ancient commentators thought that Hebrews 8:1-6 showed the heavenly quality of Christian worship, and later interpreters said that Christ's priesthood in the heavenly tabernacle was exercised in earthly tabernacles/temples through earthly priests, who offered the Lord's Supper as a sacramental/eucharistic sacrifice. The sixteenth-century Reformers (1500s), however, read the text not only as a critique of the Levitical order but of the church of their own time, which had devised rituals that God had not commanded (see Calvin, Hebrews, 107-8). Seventeenth-century English Baptists (1600s) took the reformation to its logical, biblical conclusions by rejecting a state church, affirming the ministry believer priests with only two church offices (pastors and deacons by qualified males), and were committed to a regenerate church membership with believer's baptism rather than infant baptism.

In the end it is clear that Hebrews assumes that Christ's heavenly ministry (Heb 8:2, 6) undergirds earthly Christian worship (12:28-29) wherein believers do not forsake the assembling of themselves together (Heb 10:24-25). And His once for all self-sacrifice gives rise to spiritual sacrifices of praise and good works by all His followers (Heb 13:15-16). A place remains for leadership in the local community of faith (Heb 13:7, 17), but Hebrews does not call these leaders "priests" and nowhere are they called to function as such. Seven Aspects of Jesus' Better Ministry in Heaven

- 1. A Better Mediator A Son Forever Perfected as Our Eternal High Priest! (4:14–7:28; especially 7:1-28)
 - 2. A Better Ministry Exalted to Sit and Serve in the True Tabernacle in Heaven! (8:1-6)
 - 3. A Better Covenant Newly Established on Better Promises! (8:7-13; cf. 7:22)
 - **4.** A Better Sanctuary Heavenly One Not Made with Hands! (9:1-10)
 - **5.** A Better Sacrifice Sacrificed Himself Once for All! (9:11-28)
 - 6. A Better Perfection Eternally Sanctified by Christ's Sacrifice! (10:1-18)
 - 7. A Better Hope We Can Now Draw Near Boldy Where He Already Is and We Will Do So Bodily in the Future When He Comes Again! (6:18-20; 7:19; 9:11, 24, 28)

All 7 of these aspects are repeatedly interconnected in Chapters 8-10!
