Questions God Asks: How Will You Respond?

Lesson Two • Genesis 4:1-16
What Have You Done?

God's Question: "What have you done?"

Cain KILLED his brother in the context of worship after rejecting God's warning and suffered the just consequences of his sin.

We should not be like Cain, who was of the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his own deeds were evil and his brother's righteous. 1 John 3:12

Woe to them! For they walked in the way of Cain... Jude 11

The Way of Cain

The way of Cain is the way to RUIN as a result of unchecked sin within.

There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death. Proverbs 16:25

The Way of Cain Is the Way to Ruin

Step 1: Live with an UNCHECKED Heart!

God's Checkpoint of Grace

God lovingly came to Cain with QUESTIONS about his sinful heart (v. 6-7).

Step 2: Disregard God's WARNING!

God's Checkpoint of Grace

God graciously gave Cain a WARNING about the danger of sin (v. 7).

Step 3: Open the DOOR to Greater Sin!

God's Checkpoint of Grace

The DISCIPLINE of the Lord was a sign of His love for Cain (*Hebrews 12:7-11, 14-15*).

Step 4: Refuse to REPENT of Your Sin!

God's Checkpoint of Grace

God's QUESTIONS were an opportunity for Cain to repent and come right with God (v. 9-10).

Step 5: Suffer the RUIN in Your Life!

God's Checkpoint of Grace

God's MARK on Cain's life was also a mark of God's grace in Cain's life (v. 11-16).

What a Religious Person Is Capable Of

We are all capable of WALKING in the "way of Cain" toward our ruin.

*The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it?"
Jeremiah 17:9*

What a Gracious God Offers

Abel's blood was forcibly taken but Jesus' BLOOD was freely given so our sins can be forgiven through repentance and faith.

To Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. Hebrews 12:24 NIV
If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9
