Summer in the Psalms

Lesson Five • Psalm 22
The Suffering King

Main Point of Psalm 22

Jesus the Messiah-King SUFFERED and died so that, like Him, people from every nation could be rescued for the praise of the Lord.

The Suffering King

1. Meditate on the AGONY of the Messiah-King!

Jesus' Agony

- Jesus was FORSAKEN by God (v. 1-2).
- Jesus was DESPISED by people (v. 6-8).
- Jesus was SURROUNDED by enemies (v. 12-18).

Jesus' Confidence

Yet Jesus TRUSTED in God to deliver Him based on God's faithfulness (v. 3-5, 9-11).

2. Meditate on the CRY of the Messiah-King!

Jesus' Cry

Jesus cried out to God to DELIVER Him from death (v. 19-21).

Turning Point

God ANSWERED Him. How? Jesus died, but God delivered Him by His resurrection (v. 21).

3. Meditate on the PRAISE of the Messiah-King!

Jesus' Praise

- Jesus PRAISES the name of the Lord to the people of God (v. 22-26).
- Jesus PREDICTS the nations of the world will worship the Lord (v. 27-31).

Takeaway

God has DONE it; He has provided salvation through the death and resurrection of His Son. Therefore, turn from your sin and trust in Jesus for your salvation.

COMMUNION

Participating in the Lord's Supper

Followers of Jesus Christ (those who trust Christ for salvation, identify with Christ in baptism, and commit to Christ's body in membership of a local church of like faith and practice) are invited to participate in Communion located at the four tables in the auditorium. **After you take the bread and cup back to your seat, PLEASE WAIT so we may eat and drink together.** The bread and juice represent the body and blood of Jesus when He died on the Cross and reminds us who our Lord is, what He has done for us, is doing for us, and will yet do for us when He returns. Come, Lord Jesus, come!
