- 5. For each gift you purchase, you receive a Christmas Card with a Mission Description for you to give the recipient. (For mail-in orders, the cards will be mailed to you for you to distribute.)

### 1. Covenant Presbyterian Preschool

The Preschool provides a morning play-based experience for children ages 9 months to 4 years old. The program is dedicated to the Christian nurture of each child in all areas of development: spiritual, social, intellectual, physical, and emotional. As a ministry of the church, the Preschool has a scholarship fund designated to ensure ALL children can enroll. Additionally, to facilitate creativity and imagination, our recently added Learning Garden/STEM Lab can benefit from gifts to purchase resources that will continue to inspire and encourage our next generation of bold thinkers.

We Will Go seeks to be a neighbor to those in the downtown Jackson community, focusing on education, essential food and engagement. This is done through distributing groceries to low-income families, offering after-school care with a focus on literacy and providing all day summer learning for students in need. All programs are centered around evangelism and sharing the love of Christ. Undesignated funds will go to needs such as the afterschool program, groceries for clients, new playground, loading dock, walk-in freezer and fridge, and new ceiling tiles and flooring in the food ministry building.

#### 6. Student Education Program in Honduras

Since the Salt and Light Ministry Foundation was formed in 2004, churches and individuals in the U.S. have been providing education assistance to help keep students in school. Education provides opportunities to lead a better and more productive life than simply becoming manual labor in an agrarian country. Currently, one adult Sunday School class and several Covenant members sponsor elementary, secondary and college students. Those who qualify for the program receive school uniforms, new shoes, books and school supplies at the beginning of the school year in February. Students must have an 80 average to qualify for the program and maintain a 70 average to remain in it.

There are students who do not qualify for sponsorships, however. The ministry helps them with school supplies when funds or extra materials are available. Teachers in the public schools are in need, too, working with minimal supplies or often doing without. They also seldom have any funds for recreational equipment, like soccer balls for their students. Salt and Light tries to provide for teachers when a need is identified.

#### 7. Wycliffe Bible Translators

#### 8. The Outreach Foundation - Kenya

Ongoing drought in East Africa, coupled with rising prices, has resulted in increased food insecurity for many Kenyans. The Foundation also supports boarding schools, such as those Covenant teams have helped build, that can save young girls from early marriage and provide the chance for a better life through education.
