SHEPHERD GUIDE

Take time to prepare your heart and mind by spending time in the Word reading 1 Kings 10-12. Note your observations about God's character and how you see God working so you can share them with the kids.

God had abundantly blessed Solomon. with wisdom, riches, and fame. He was known by all as the wisest man to have ever lived. God's helped him lead Israel with wisdom, but this wouldn't last forever. Solomon began turning away from God, slipping into disobedience and outright idolatry, causing the downfall of his family.

We want our kids to see that a divided heart - a heart that worships God AND something else (even if it's a good thing!) - leads to sin and trouble. God wants us to walk in wisdom and faithfulness, which means we need to rely on Him for strength and direction, which is found by listening and obeying His Word.



When the children arrive, introduce yourself, ask them their name, welcome them to the class, and invite them to play with the other children. When most kids have arrived for first service, ask them to clean up the toys and find a seat at one of the tables to begin the class.



LESSON OVERVIEW

Ask the class: Have you ever been given a gift or a reward and not been happy with what you were given? It's pretty normal for people to want more than what they have or have been given. Today, we're going to read more about Solomon, who had all the riches but still wanted more.

Summarize 1 Kings 10-12 and then discuss the following questions in table groups or together as a class:

What can happen when God's leaders don't set a good example in worship?

Explain how unfaithful leaders can sometimes lead others astray. When Solomon was unfaithful to God, the people began to turn away as well. Solomon was the leader of God's people, and he set up idols. The people followed after him.

How can the friends we have affect our walk with God? Guide kids to recall that Solomon, who was once so obedient to God, was heavily influenced by the women he married. Their worship of idols divided his heart, away from full devotion to God. People we spend time with can help us grow closer to God, or they can lead us to worship things other than God.

How is Jesus better than an earthly king? Discuss with kids that while David and Solomon were mostly good kings, we realize they were far from perfect. Their sin separated them from God. There is only one true eternal king—King Jesus. There is no one like Him. Jesus rules with perfect love, justice, and goodness.



ACTIVITY:

Kings in Cups

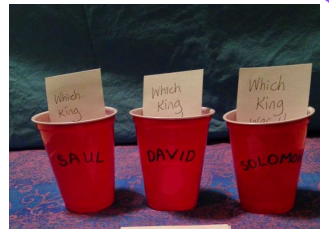
3 solo cups – Saul, David and Solomon, list of review questions

Play this fun review game to go over what we have learned about King Saul, King David and King Solomon over the past 7 weeks!

Set up the 3 cups with “Saul,” “David,” and “Solomon” at one end of a table in the front of the room.

Ask a review question and call on a volunteer to answer it. If they get it correct, let them come up to the opposite end of the table and try to throw a ping pong ball in the correct cup. (Let them have up to three tries).

After they sit down, ask the next question and repeat as time allows.

BIBLE TRAINING 101

Prayer Jar

“Gotta Know the Books” song on USB, Prayer Jar

Review the Books of the Bible song that they have been learning the last few weeks. (It's on the TV's USB) “Gotta Know the Books” (<https://youtu.be/v3aRB1xMs5g>.)

Have the children sit in a circle and pull out the Prayer Jar. Ask for volunteers to pull a slip of paper from the jar and invite them to pray for the topic they pulled.

Once everyone who wants to participate in the prayer pulls a slip of paper, start the prayer and have them go around the circle - each praying for their topic. Once it get's back to you, close the prayer.

Discuss how we can talk to God at any time, in any place and about anything! He sees, hears and cares for us. Praying and talking to God throughout our day is one of the ways we can be near to Him as He helps us listen and obey His Word.
