Jesus was praised! When Jesus was entering the city of Jerusalem, people lined the road into town and did something we probably would never do...they laid down their cloaks (coats) and picked up palm branches and began shouting, "Hosanna!" (which is a type of praise). Jesus was the King of the Jews so they praised Him. Their act of laying down their cloaks symbolized honor for a king. And the palm branches were waved because they symbolized victory and were used to honor royalty. This act of laying down cloaks and waving palm branches was their way of giving honor to Jesus and praising Him. Remember to praise Jesus today!

17 Did You Know?

Jesus got mad! When you think about Jesus, I bet you never think about Him getting angry, do you? But there was a time in the Bible when He got extremely upset. In the Jerusalem temple, Jesus found people who had set up tables inside the temple court. These people were selling doves and animals that were needed for the Passover sacrifice and there were also people charging extra fees for exchanging money (if you didn't have Hebrew coins to buy the doves and animals). When Jesus saw this, He overturned tables and asked people to get out. But Jesus did this to remind people that the temple was not meant for selling things. It's not a place to make money or take advantage of people by charging more for things than normal. It's a place where people can go to confess their sins and talk to God. Jesus wanted to make sure people were using the temple as it should be used.

18 Did You Know?

Jesus asks us to give! We are to give to God and also to our government. In Mark 12, we see a group of Pharisees (religious teachers) asking Jesus about whether they must pay taxes to the government. Jesus goes on to say that yes, you do need to pay taxes to the government. But, you also need to give to God what is God's (which is called a tithe). A tithe is 10% of whatever money we have. So if you have \$100 saved up, you would give God \$10. God doesn't ask for much, but sometimes we have a hard time letting go of that 10%. My challenge to you is to practice saving the money you get from chores or allowances. And then every week or every month (however often you want to give your offering to God), take 10% of your savings and give it to Him (at church or to an organization that honors God by helping others).

Jesus received authority from God! His authority on earth came from God and this was hard for some people to believe back then. Those people being the Pharisees! They were always trying to disprove whom Jesus said He was...the Son of God! For some reason, these priests couldn't grasp that Jesus was the Son of God and that He came into the world to save all people. They felt like He wasn't telling the truth. But we know that Jesus was telling the truth and that Jesus is the Truth. Never doubt Jesus and His love for you.

21 Did You Know?

Jesus was anointed! But what exactly does being anointed mean? To be anointed means you have been poured with oil or perfume. It's something that priests did to sick people, but it's also something they did to prepare bodies for death. In our story today, a woman comes to the home of Simon the Leper to find Jesus. She brings with her an expensive jar of perfume and she pours it over His head. The disciples were shocked and felt that she wasted it, but Jesus told them that what she had done would be something she would always be remembered for. She did this to prepare His body for death (because soon He would be crucified on the cross and sacrificed for our sins in order to save us). Have you ever seen someone be anointed with oil?

22 Did You Know?

Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life! He is talking with His disciples (who are very confused at what He is saying), and He reminds them that the only way anyone can come to God the Father is through Him. Jesus is the way...the only way. In our world today there are some who will tell you that if you do good deeds and live your life right, then that will get you into heaven. But we, as Christians, know that's not the way to get to heaven. Jesus tells us plain and simple that we must believe in Him because that's the ONLY way to God the Father who lives in heaven. In order for us to live forever with God, we need to believe in God's Son, Jesus, as our Savior. We need to believe that He forgives us of our sins and that He came to this earth to save us.

They were confused, scared, shocked, unsure of what was going to happen. They might have even been thinking about how they were going to remember all that Jesus had taught them over the past three years. Jesus knew everything those disciples were thinking, too. He knew they would be worried. And that's when Jesus said that God promises to send the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit would be there to teach them and guide them and help them remember everything He taught them. There was no need to fear and no need to worry. I am so grateful that Jesus promised the Holy Spirit to His disciples and that He promises us the Holy Spirit today, too.

Jesus gives us peace! Jesus had just finished telling the disciples that He would leave the earth, but that God would send the Holy Spirit to be with them. They might have been scared and sad. Maybe that's why He immediately told them that He gives peace. Jesus is telling them (and telling us) that we are not to be afraid of anything. Why? Because He is the One who will bring us peace. He gives it to us freely and offers it to us as a gift. Are you feeling scared about something? Pray and ask Jesus to give you His peace.

25 Did You Know?

Jesus was betrayed! And He was betrayed by one of His own 12 disciples! Can you believe it? The Bible tells us that Satan entered into Judas Iscariot and he made the decision to betray Jesus and give Him over to the chief priests and be arrested. What sweetened this decision for Judas is that they agreed to pay him. Judas loved money and loved having a lot of it! He would get thirty pieces of silver for betraying Jesus. Thirty pieces of silver would be worth anywhere between \$185-\$216 in U.S. dollars today. So Judas didn't make a whole lot of money for giving Jesus over to the chief priests and officials. It makes me sad that Judas Iscariot chose to betray Jesus, His friend and teacher. Does it make you sad, too?

Jesus ate a last meal with His disciples! On the night that He was arrested, He gathered with His disciples in a large upper room in a home. There they ate the Passover meal together one last night. At this meal were bread and wine. As He gave each of them some bread and gave them wine to drink, He said, "Do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19b). Jesus wanted His disciples to think about Him and remember Him every time they ate bread and drank wine. Those things symbolized His body and His blood. Jesus gave His life for us and He wants us to remember the sacrifice He made for us and to remember how much He loves us.

The crowd included chief priests and elders of the people. But it also included a very familiar face... Judas Iscariot, one of Jesus' disciples. It was then that Judas gave Jesus over to the chief priests and elders! The disciples were upset! Peter even cut off the ear of one of the men because he was so mad at what was happening! But Jesus told them to calm down. This had to happen. It was part of God's plan to save the world and free us from our sins. Jesus had to be arrested, but it was still hard for the disciples to watch! Would you have been upset like they were?

When Jesus said that, Peter quickly said that would never happen. Why would he ever deny knowing Jesus? He loved Jesus! Would you ever do what Peter did? I pray you will shout from the rooftops how much you love Jesus. I pray you will let your life shine the light of Jesus so brightly.

Jesus was crucified! Jesus was nailed to a cross, suffered, and died. Jesus' death is sad and is hard to talk about. Sometimes we just want to skip over the crucifixion and death part and focus on His resurrection. But His death was what gave us free access to God. It is what we base our Christianity on. And it's a vital part of who we are as Christians. So let's thank God for sending Jesus to die for us. Without His death, we would not be able to live forever with Him in heaven. And for that, I am eternally grateful.

Jesus was buried in a tomb! After He died, a man named Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for Jesus' body so he could bury it. Joseph was a Pharisee (the group of religious leaders who had just crucified Jesus). However, Joseph was not like them. He actually believed in Jesus. He believed that Jesus was God's Son and that He was the Messiah, the One sent into the world to save us from our sins. He took Jesus' body, wrapped it in linen cloth, and placed it in one of his tombs. He wanted to do this one thing for Him because he loved Jesus.

They were busy discussing all the events that had taken place over the past few days, from Jesus' arrest and death to His resurrection. Suddenly Jesus came up to them and walked with them. But they did not know it was Jesus. He asked what they were discussing and they told Him about all the events. Then He explained everything to them that was said in the Scriptures about Himself. And they STILL didn't know it was Jesus! Jesus stayed with them and when He broke bread, gave thanks for it, and gave it to them, their eyes were opened and they saw Jesus! Are your eyes open to see Jesus today?

35 Did You Know?

Jesus appeared to His disciples! They had heard from the women that His body was not in the tomb. They ran to the tomb to see for themselves. But they had yet to see Jesus alive. Mary Magdalene had seen Jesus, and two other friends had seen Jesus on the road to Emmaus, but not them. When would Jesus show Himself to His close friends? At the moment when they were discussing Jesus appearing to their two friends on the road to Emmaus, Jesus appeared to them! They were in such a state of shock, I think, because Jesus said it looked like they had seen a ghost. He even showed them His hands and feet and let them see the scars. And He also told them to touch Him so they would realize He was real. Would you have been in shock to see the risen Jesus like they were?

Jesus tells Thomas to put his finger where the nails have been and in His side. And then Jesus says to Thomas, "Stop doubting and believe." (John 20:27b). Have you ever doubted Jesus was real? May you know that He is real and He is alive! Have faith and believe!

37 Did You Know?

Jesus had breakfast with His disciples! The disciples got to experience this early one morning after they had seen Jesus alive. They were out fishing and hadn't caught much. Then a man on the shore told them where to drop their nets and when they did, they caught 153 fish! It was then they recognized that man to be Jesus. Peter was so excited, he jumped off the boat and swam to shore. Then Jesus invited them to come and eat breakfast with Him. And guess what they ate? Fish and bread! I believe the disciples were thrilled to see Jesus once again (this was the third time He had appeared to them after His resurrection). I believe they talked a lot to Jesus early that morning at breakfast. I believe they wanted to soak up as much of Jesus as they could and were eager to talk and listen to Him. What would you have asked Jesus over breakfast on the beach?

38 Did You Know?

Jesus told Peter to feed His sheep! What in the world does that mean? At breakfast on the beach, Jesus kept asking Peter if he loved Him. Why would He keep asking a silly question like that? Of course Peter loved Jesus. After the third time, Peter began to feel hurt. Surely Jesus knew that Peter did love Him very much! Jesus' response after Peter said "yes" all those times when He asked him if he loved Him, was a simple reminder to "Feed my lambs. Take care of my sheep. Feed my sheep." (John 21:15b, 16b, 17b). Was Jesus really asking him to take care and feed His sheep that lived in the pasture? No, the sheep Jesus was referring to were people like us. Did You Know?
