We're thankful for you and your desire to serve in our ministry with kids! As a ministry team, we are partnering with families to help kids know, love, and follow Jesus! Who can be a Junior Shepherd?

Someone who:

- Is in 5th Grade through 17 years old
- Has been an attendee of LEFC for at least 6 months

Guidelines

- A Junior Shepherd must always be working with at least one adult in the classroom at all times.
- We ask that Junior Shepherds be at least 16 years old if they are serving in the infant nurseries.
- Females ages 16 and older may change diapers or assist with bathroom needs for younger children.
- At the start of the school year when you are 18, we ask you to complete your staterequired clearances for serving with children.
- We ask students who would like to serve as a Junior Shepherd to read and sign these
 expectations <u>each year</u>.

Punctuality

- Be on time (8:30am for first service, 10:20am for second service)
- Attend the VIP meeting (Vision, Info, and Prayer)

Responsibilities

- Respect and follow directions of the leaders and shepherds who are guiding you.
- Be a good role model! The kids are watching you.
- No talking on the phone, texting, or taking photos/videos.
- No horseplay or roughhousing; no piggyback or shoulder rides

- You may not hold children that are in 1st-4th grades in your lap. Children this age may sit beside you.
- If you will be absent, find a substitute and/or contact your Coordinator

- Be prepared to lead/help with any activity that is listed on that week's lesson plan.
- Check with the Shepherd before leaving for the day. For example, say: "Is there anything else I can do to help before I leave?"

Initiative

- See a need, fill a need
- As the adult Shepherd what he or she would like you to do
- Look for opportunities to serve (help clean up toys, assist with craft or snack, operate TV, etc)
- Strive to develop friendships with the kids. Look for ways to encourage them and be a friend.
- Pray for the kids. You are helping to make an eternal difference in their lives.
- Be attentive and warmly welcome children who are new!
