OUTLINE



Arrival/Attendance/ Directed Play

10:40-11:05

Welcome the children and mark them as present on the attendance sheet on the clipboard by the door. Set up the activities and introduce the children to the lesson through these activities. Encourage the kids to participate in both activities as they play together. You may need to ask the kids to come to the different areas so all of them have the opportunity to participate.

How Tall Are We?

- Use the section of poster paper taped to the wall to mark the top of each child's head. Write their name next to the mark for their height. Some children may already be on the page, if they were also in first service. Explain that all of our friends are different heights because some friends grow faster than others.
- SAY In our story today, we are learning about Jesus as he grows up! He is learning, which means his brain is growing! We are learning and growing too. Which of our friends is growing fastest?

What do we look like when we get older?

- Show the children the pictures of people in various stages of life. Have them help you organize the pictures from youngest to oldest.
- SAY Jesus is growing up! As he grows from a baby to a boy, and from a boy to a man, he will look different. You all will look different as you grow up too. When you get home, you should ask your families to see pictures of what you looked like as a baby!

Clean Up and Gather for Story

11:05-11:10

Invite the children to begin cleaning up toys and putting away their activities at 9:10. Then remind them to meet at the carpet for Bible story time. Remind the children that we are going to do our best to be good listeners.

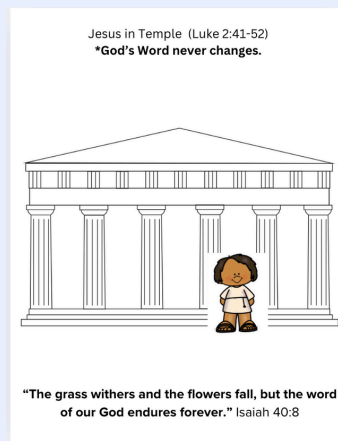
Craft/Coloring Page

11:25-11:35

After the story, have the children go to their tables and prepare for a craft to go along with the lesson. Our **BIG IDEA** of the week is: Jesus Heals Our Brokenness!

Distribute the picture of the temple and crayons to all of the children and allow them to color it. As each child finishes, help them to glue one of the pictures of Jesus to the middle of their picture.

As children finish , distribute the coloring page with today's story on the back for children to continue coloring. have the children place both the craft and coloring sheet in their bin when they are finished.

Prayer (Use these words, or your own, to pray about today's Bible lesson. Take time to listen to prayer requests from the children and pray for them as well!)

Memory Verse

- "Come to me and I will give you rest." **Matthew 11:28**
- Explain that God wants to help us when we need him. Teach the children the motions for this verse:
 - Come to me- point your thumbs toward yourself
 - and I will give- lay your hands flat in front of you with palms up
 - you rest- lay your cheek on your hands like you are sleeping
- Have the children join you in saying the verse and doing the motions several times to practice. Ask the children if anyone would like to do the verse on their own. If someone needs help, have them pick a friend or do it with them. If no one volunteers, repeat as a class twice more.

Snack Time at Tables

11:55-12:05

Prior to serving the snack have the children use hand sanitizer before choosing a seat at the table. Each child will have veggie straws on a napkin and a small cup of water. **NOTE:** some children with allergies will have their own snack or drink...parents usually remind shepherds of this at drop off. While the children are eating their snack, please read the read aloud book that is in the bin labeled Read Aloud book for snack time. Thanks.





Free Choice Play

12:05-12:15

Once the snack and read aloud are finished, the children may choose free play until their parents come to pick them up.

At dismissal, please make sure to check the child's tag number to match the parent's tag. Have the children take home any papers from their bin. Finally, check them off the attendance as being picked up (the last column for the date).
