SERMON RECAP

Believers are called to honor and encourage those who serve, especially when ministry takes unexpected turns or ends sooner than planned. Using the illustration of a Formula 1 team, Joel reminded us that both front-line ministers and behind-thescenes workers are essential to God's mission.

THE LEAD IN

 Using Joel's F1 example from Sunday morning, if you had to be part of a Formula 1 team, would you rather be the driver in the cockpit or the pit crew in the garage? Why?

GETTING INTO THE TEXT

- Read Philippians 2:19-30. Looking at Timothy and Epaphroditus, what stands
 out to you about the way Paul speaks of them? What do the titles brother, fellow
 worker, and fellow soldier communicate about their relationship and ministry?
- In your own words, how would you explain the difference between a fellow worker and a fellow soldier in gospel ministry? Where do you think your current ministry role might fit on that spectrum?

GOING DEEPER

- Why do you think Paul goes to such lengths to affirm and honor Epaphroditus when sending him home? What might have happened if Paul hadn't done that?
- Read 1 Thessalonians 5:12–13. How does this instruction compare to Paul's call to "receive [Epaphroditus] in the Lord with all joy" in Philippians 2:29?
- Tell us about someone who made a significant impact in your life. What's a practical way you could encourage, affirm, or honor them this week?

PRAYER

 Take some time as a group to thank God for the people who have served you and LEFC faithfully. Ask God to show you who to honor this week and the courage to do so.
