Notes and Reminders

As you prepare for this week, read Genesis 1-2. Does anything stand out to you in the story? Why do we note that God sees the things he created as 'good'? How can our understanding of this story help us to tell it to the children in our class?

OUTLINE



Arrival/Attendance/ Directed Play

8:55-9:10

Welcome the children and mark them as present on the attendance sheet on the clipboard by the door. Set up the activities and introduce the children to the lesson through these activities. Encourage the kids to participate in both activities as they play together. You may need to ask the kids to come to the different areas so all of them have the opportunity to participate

Creation Mural

- Roll out the large poster paper onto a table. Give the children markers or crayons to color with. Encourage them to draw the sun, the moon, and stars to think about the light in the sky. Help them to draw fish and birds to think about the fifth day of creation. Help the children draw different animals to think about when God made all the animals that live on the land. Help them to draw people! Encourage the children to draw blankets and pillows to think about when God rested to finish the seventh day of creation.
- **SAY** What was your favorite thing we drew today? (Allow responses). On the fourth day of creation God made the sun, moon and stars in the sky. On the fifth day of creation, God made all of the sea animals and birds in the sky. On the sixth day, God made all of the land animals. He made people on the sixth day too! God saw that everything he made was very good. On the seventh day God rested, because creation was complete!

Creation Puzzle

- Help the children spread out all of the pieces face up on a table. have the children work as a team to assemble the pieces to discover the hidden picture! the puzzle will be 5 pieces across and 4 pieces tall when finished.
- **SAY** You completed the puzzle! our puzzle had lots of pieces to put together before it was complete. It took God seven days to complete all of creation!





Clean Up and Gather for Story

9:10-9:15

Invite the children to begin cleaning up toys and putting away their activities at 9:10. Then remind them to meet at the carpet for Bible story time. Remind the children that we are going to do our best to be good listeners.

Bible Story


9:15-9:30

Welcome Song

- Welcome all the children by singing their welcome song
- (Tune of Twinkle Twinkle Little Star)
- Welcome, Welcome Everyone
- Now you're here Let's have some fun
- First let's clap our hands like so
- Then reach down and touch our toes
- Welcome, Welcome Everyone
- Now you're here Let's have some fun
 - You can call a group of children names to welcome them and they can stand up and wave if you'd like.

Begin telling the story of Creation. You can use Spark Bible pgs. 2-7 (focus on days 4,5,6, 7) and you can use the words below and the visual pictures for days 4,5,6,7 of creation in the bin if you'd like.

On the fourth day, God said, "Let there be a sun and a moon and stars!" **GLIMMER! SHIMMER! SHINE!** There was a sun and a moon and thousands of stars. God saw that the sun and the moon and stars were good. On the fifth day, God said, "Let there be sea animals that swim and birds that fly!" **WIGGLE! SPLISH! SPLASH!** There were sea animals. **FLUTTER! PUTTER! TWEET!** There were birds. God saw that the sea animals and birds were good. On the sixth day, God said, "Let there be animals of every kind on the earth!" **GROWL! PROWL! SNORT!** There were animals with fur. **SKITTER! SKATTER! CREEP!** There were bugs. **SLITHER, SLINK, HOP!** There were reptiles. God saw that the animals and bugs and reptiles were good. Then God said, "Let there be people on the earth!" **BLINK! WINK! HICCUP!** There were people on the earth. God saw that the people were very good. On the seventh day, God said, "It is time to rest!" **WHEW! PSHEW! AHHH!** God and all creation rested.






Craft/Coloring Page

9:30-9:40

After the story, have the children go to their tables and prepare for a craft to go along with the lesson. Our **BIG IDEA** of the week is: **God Created All Things!**

Pass out the worksheet with Days 4,5,6,7 and allow the children to color the pictures and review all that God created.

As children finish, distribute the coloring page with the Creation story on the back for children to continue coloring. have the children place both the craft and coloring sheet in their bin when they are finished.

Songs/Memory Verse/Prayer

9:50-10:05

Memory Verse

- "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1
- This is the third week of the children learning this verse. Help them to practice the motions again, and see who remembers them well!
 - In the beginning- point to your watch (or pretend if you aren't wearing a watch)
 - God created- squeeze your hands together like you are making something out of play dough
 - The heavens- Raise your hands high and wiggle your fingers
 - and the earth- put your hands on the ground
 - Genesis 1:1- hold up one finger on each hand as you say the numbers
- Have the kids join you in saying the verse and doing the motions several times to practice. Ask the children if anyone would like to do the verse on their own. If someone needs help, have them pick a friend or do it with them. If no one volunteers, repeat as a class twice more.

Snack Time at Tables

10:05-10:15

Prior to serving the snack have the children use hand sanitizer before choosing a seat at the table. Each child will have veggie straws on a napkin and a small cup of water. **NOTE:** some children with allergies will have their own snack or drink...parents usually remind shepherds of this at drop off. While the children are eating their snack, please read the read aloud book that is in the bin labeled Read Aloud book for snack time. Thanks.





Free Choice Play

10:15-10:40

Once the snack and read aloud are finished, the children may choose free play until their parents come to pick them up.

At dismissal, please make sure to check the child's tag number to match the parent's tag. Have the children take home any papers from their bin. Finally, check them off the attendance as being picked up (the last column for the date).

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
