Title: "All My Springs Are in You"

Text: Psalm 87

Date: March 19, 2023

Big Idea

Psalm 87 has a lot to teach us about global missions. We see, first, that it's all ultimately God's doing; second, that it's for all peoples (even our enemies); and, third, that it advances as an overflow of joy in him!

Lesson #1: It's by God's Doing (vv. 1-3)

When these psalmists mention this city they're talking about the place of God's reign and rule, the place of restored relationship between God and man, the place where the curse is undone and things are made forever right. They're talking about paradise, about heaven, about the world as is should be. It's what was pictured in the promised land with Jerusalem, or mount Zion, with the temple and the coming together of God and man by way of the altar of sacrifice. But that picture was ultimately pointing to the new Jerusalem, a heavenly Jerusalem, as John tells us about in Rev. 21:1-7. And this city is founded by God, with Jesus as the cornerstone.

Implication #1: We Have No Right to Change the Message

Implication #2: We Have No Power to Make Things Happen

Lesson #2: It's for All Peoples (vv. 4-6)

God wants us to see that what he has in mind here with this new Jerusalem and new covenant isn't just for Israel as she's ethnically defined. It's for all peoples who would, in a sense, come into Israel, come into the people of God, through Christ, the promised offspring of Abraham (cf. Gal. 3:26-29). But more than that, with this list of na-

tions and cities God gives us back in Ps. 87:4, the most scandalous part about all this is the fact that every nation or city on this list, at one point or another had been a bitter enemy. And yet all of these are said to be, in some way, a part of the citizenship of Zion (cf. Eph. 2:11-22)!

These verses were meant to jar the Jewish people I think—to wake them back up to their purpose, to their mission, to the reason he saved and blessed them in the first place. God had always saved them with a view to saving the nations. He'd always blessed them with a view to blessing the nations. But in the midst of that blessing and things, they forgot their purpose. Let's not forget ours!

Lesson #3: It's from an Overflow of Joy (v. 7)

A spring as you know, in one sense, has two dimensions to it. It has both depth and breadth. There is something subterranean, underground. And then there is something that spills over and flows out. And I think this is a helpful image, because usually when it comes to missions we think of that second dimension: the breadth, the outflow. We think of the waters flowing to the nations and bringing life there. And that is good.

But, and here's the critical point, the only way a spring gets breadth is if it also has depth. If we don't have depth we won't have breadth. We will dry up. But as we give ourselves truly to deep relationship with God, where we're soaking in grace, and marked by satisfaction and joy, we won't be able to help but have breadth, because he will move our hearts with the things that move his!

Reflection Questions

- Which of the three lessons for global missions identified above seems most significant to you personally right now and why?
- If you were the Israelites reading (or singing!) this psalm, how would you feel when you came to v. 4 with its references to your historic enemies? Be honest. Why should such a thing be, not troubling, but encouraging?
- As we close out this year's Missions Emphasis Week, what's one way you could apply what you've been learning to the weeks and year ahead?
