"All Things to All People": Contextualizing the Gospel to Title:

Reach Jew and Gentile

Acts 16:1-5 Text:

-O- Big Idea

If we're going to be effective witnesses for Jesus in this world we must be skilled in contextualizing the gospel. But what is contextualization and how do we do it? Let's learn together!

Contextualization, as I might define it, is the Christian's effort to bring the gospel meaningfully to all sorts of people, from all sorts of cultural backgrounds, in all sorts of different contexts, in a way that makes sense to them, that resonates with them, that scratches where they itch, and so forth. It brings the unchanging gospel to an ever-changing world in a form and fashion which they can readily understand. It brings God's good news into man's unique context. It holds unapologetically to the essential core of the Christian faith and yet remains flexible and charitable in the non-essential externals. It's a leaning in towards others so we can lead them out towards Christ.

1. In Our Text

"As an uncircumcised son of a mixed marriage, Timothy would have been regarded by Jews in the region as '... an apostate Jew.'... Paul was bound to circumcise Timothy if he wanted to have him as a colleague, otherwise 'he would have . . . [seemed to be a supporter of] apostasy and would no longer have been allowed to appear in any synagogue.'...[I]t was [therefore] 'both proper and expedient for Paul to circumcise him. As Paul saw it, being a good Christian did not mean being a bad Jew. Rather, it meant being a fulfilled Jew. Paul had no desire to flout Jewish scruples in his endeavour to bring both Jews and Gentiles to salvation in Christ." - PNTC

Interestingly enough, what first seemed like an irreconcilable tension in this text is shown at the end to truly be something held in beautiful balance. You see, what comes out here is this: even while these early Christians (Paul, Silas, Timothy) are moving out to bring the gospel to

the Gentiles, they are at the same time still ordering much of their actions with a view to reaching the Jews as well.

2. In Our Lives

Expression #1: We Give Up Our Liberties to Reach Others in Their "Rigidities"

"To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law" (1 Cor. 9:20).

Expression #2: We Give Up Our Rigidities to Reach Others in Their "Liberties"

"To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law" (1 Cor. 9:21).

"Proper contextualization means causing the right scandal—the one the gospel poses to all sinners-and removing all unnecessary ones." - Tim Keller

3. In Our Savior

Contextualization is hard. And we'll be tempted sometimes to go too far in one direction or another. How do you accommodate others without conforming to them? How do you care for them without capitulating to them? How do you hold firmly to truth while bending and flexing in love? I think the key to all of this is we've got to keep our eyes on Jesus (cf. 1 Cor. 10:3).

Reflection Questions

- If you're a Christian, think about how you first came to believe, how you were reached with the gospel. In what ways was the gospel "contextualized" for you by those who were sharing it with you?
- Which of the two expressions identified above seems hardest for you and why?
- Think of the people in your life whom God is calling and sending you to reach. What might it look like for you to contextualize the gospel for them?
