Midnight Melodies (Part 1) Title:

-O- Big Idea

When we leave Christ to pursue gain in the here and now, we lose in the end. When we count all as loss for the sake of Christ, we gain more than we could have ever imagined, both now and forever, in him. One of the things we gain is invincible joy. These missionaries are singing praise to God from a prison cell. Nothing can touch what they have in Jesus.

1. We Gain ... But Lose

A lot of times, when people are objecting to or rejecting Jesus, the dynamic in play is actually very similar to what we see here with these "owners" (v. 16). We are often what I'd call "smokescreen skeptics." What I mean is: we say we can't believe in Jesus for all of these intellectual, rational reasons, and we sound all smart and sophisticated as we make our case against him. But underneath these reasons of the mind, lurk some very different reasons in the heart. At the bottom, it's really quite simple: the reason I don't believe is that I don't want to. I want something else, and I fear Jesus is a threat to that. I don't want to surrender control. I don't want to let go of the reins. I want gain in the here and now, and following Christ seems like taking a loss to me. I'd have to give up this way of life, these secret pleasures, those pursuits, and so forth. And I don't want to. So I put forward a whole set of other reasons as to why faith in Jesus is illogical or whatever. We point to this or that fact and make this or that argument against him. But it's all just a smokescreen, covering and clouding over the deeper issue.

These slave-owners don't want the claims of Christianity to be true because they think Jesus is going to keep them from what they want. They have no idea that truly Jesus desires to give them, and us, even more . . . if we'd let him. The real threat to your "gain" isn't receiving Jesus, it's rejecting him.

2. We Lose ... But Gain!

After all these guys had been through, who would've blamed them if they wanted to spend their night grumbling and complaining and whining. But that's not what they're doing. Instead . . . they're singing (v. 25). Though they just got fists and rods, bars and shackles-though their teeth are busted and their lips are bloodied, it doesn't stop them from opening their mouths and making midnight melodies to the Lord their God.

I think one of the keys to having joy in suffering like this is knowing what God is doing in suffering for you. When you get a sense of what he's up to in it-how he's working for your good even in the hard-it makes it more palatable. You're able to rejoice and praise him, even though it hurts, sometimes terribly so.

#1: He Is Taking Us Deeper into His Heart (Phil. 3:7-10)

In suffering, a door is opening for deeper fellowship with Jesus.

#2: He Is Conforming Us More into His Image (Rom. 5:3-5)

The fruit of the Spirit can only really be known and developed on the vines of trial and tribulation.

#3: He Is Preparing Us Further for Glory (2 Cor. 4:16-18)

"The legs feel nothing in the stocks when the heart is in heaven" (Tertullian).

This verse could be literally rendered: "About midnight Paul and Silas, while praying, were singing hymns to God " That means the praying and the singing, the petitioning and the praising are happening simultaneously. My song is simultaneously a prayer. My praise is simultaneously a petition. Sometimes songs of praise are just an overflow of what's already on my heart. Other times, these songs or more like a prayer than anything else. "God, 'I believe; help my unbelief!' (Mark 9:24).

• When suffering comes for you, how do you typically respond? Which of the three things identified that God is up to in suffering means most to you personally and why? How might awareness of that help when things get hard?
