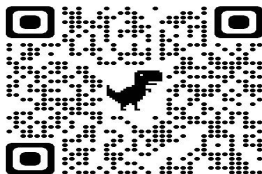

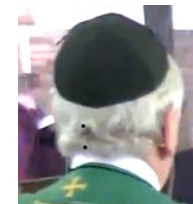

Dear Saints of St Paul's (or in the style of Frank "Greetings from the REC Department")



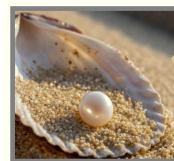
As you read this, Nancy and I will be "behind the walls" participating in REC #73 at the Johnston Unit in Winnsboro, Texas. We miss being with you but we are doing the Lord's work on your behalf.

We had never really considered participating in prison ministry until we were worshipping with St. William Laud in Pittsburg. It was one of the founding congregations of REC – Residents Encounter Christ – along with St. Philip's, Sulphur Springs and First United Methodist, Winnsboro. Members of these 3 congregations had a vision to fulfill the command expressed in Luke 4:18, to preach Good News (the Gospel) to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, and to set at liberty those who are oppressed. The liberty that Jesus is talking about is freedom from the bonds of the oppressor (Satan) and the freedom to accept God's love.

For over 20 years (with a break during COVID), a multi-denominational team of men and women have gone into the prison to deliver an intense short course in Christianity. Modeled after the Cursillo movement, the teachings, witnessing, activities, and worship draw the men into a closer and renewed relationship with God. LIVES ARE CHANGED. It is truly miraculous.

So know that you are in our hearts while we are away, and please keep us in yours with prayer. We look forward to being with you next weekend.
