What Jesus Sought to Do

- a. Jesus sought to bring **CLARITY** to what man over time had made cloudy
- b. Jesus shone a light on the **SOURCE** of the problem before addressing the **SYMPTOMS**
- c. The <u>SPIRIT</u> of the Law has more importance than the <u>LETTER</u> of the Law Jesus' 1st Example: Murder and Anger (5:21-26)
 - a. Jesus explained that murder is the symptom of an **ANGRY** heart
 - b. The time for reconciliation is always **NOW**

Jesus' 2nd Example: Adultery in the Heart (5:27-32)

- a. God has *always* defined marriage as one **MAN** and one **WOMAN** for **LIFE**
- b. As anger is the seedbed of murder, **LUST** is the seedbed of adultery external because the problem is not external.
- c. Adultery in the heart has to do with looking with the purpose to fulfill a lustful **DESIRE**
- d. Jesus' solution to this is to remove that which is causing you to **SIN**
- e. The Lord's remedy for the wicked heart is a **<u>REDEEMED</u>** heart, that trusts in **<u>CHRIST</u>**'s sufficiency
