Remembrance of Baptism

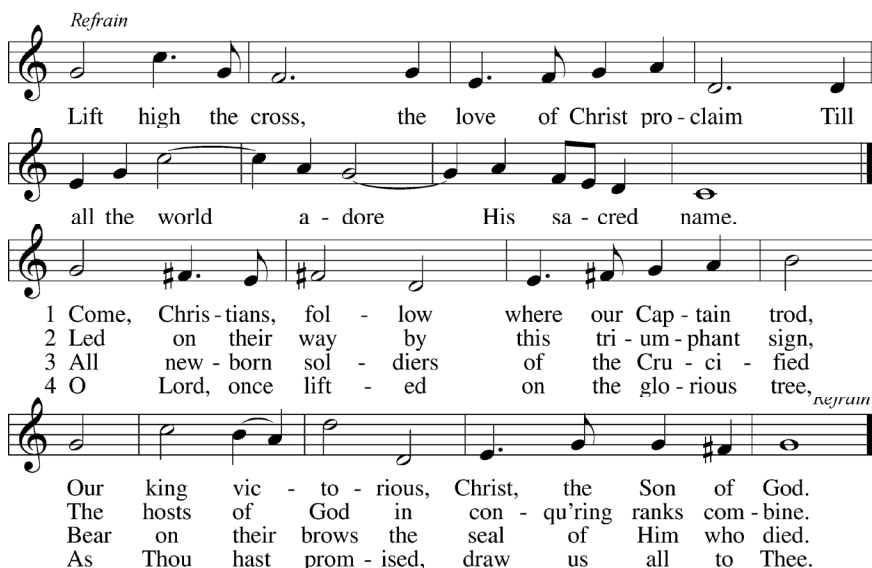
