Hebrews 11:23-31
“Seeing the Invisible”

Hebrews 11:23-31

By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. ²⁴ By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵ choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

²⁷ By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible. ²⁸ By faith he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them. ²⁹ By faith the people crossed the Red Sea as on dry land, but the Egyptians, when they attempted to do the same, were drowned.

³⁰ By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹ By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had given a friendly welcome to the spies.



The Book of Exodus (400 years later)

First 40

- Israel enslaved by Egypt
- “Beautiful” baby Moses hidden in basket in the Nile because Pharaoh ordered all Israelite baby boys to be killed
- Found and adopted by Pharaoh’s daughter
- Raised in Pharaoh’s house.



Middle 40

- Moses “sees the Invisible God” and values Him over all of Pharaoh’s riches
- He faithfully leaves Egypt and goes to Midian
- He gets married and becomes a shepherd
- God speaks to Moses in the burning bush, telling him to return to Egypt to make Pharaoh let his “Son” go .



Last 40

- Returned to Egypt and partners with brother Aaron.
- 10 Plagues (reverse creation and battling their gods) ending with the Passover
- Pharaoh let's God's "Son" go and they pass through the Red Sea, then wander for 40 years
- Moses dies
- Israel crosses the Jordan into the Promised Land.
