From Pastor Amy Michelson

Darkness is not itself evil, but, especially in biblical times, a lot of evil happened in the dark. Without streetlights or flashlights in their pockets (thank you, smart phone developers), the darkness provided cover for evil, for things that people would never have done if it were to be seen in the light. And so, light and dark became some of the go-to symbols for good and evil. That's why we hear it so much in our scripture. There are a lot of good examples of light and hope and goodness, but one of my favorites is when God promises to Abram that his descendants will be as numerous as the stars.

Picture it – Abram's talking to God, standing outside, shrouded in darkness (not evil, just darkness) and he looks up into that beautiful, clear, dark sky to see millions of specks of light. Have you ever been in a dark place, like really dark, and you look up and realize you can see SO MANY more stars than our usual places with streetlights and city lights getting in the way? It's breathtaking, isn't it? That dazzling night sky was what God chose to communicate to Abram that there was hope for him and for Sarah. All those tiny specks of light in that deep, dark sky were a promise that God had not forgotten or forsaken them.

That is part of what it means to be God's light in the world – to be people of hope, dazzling, breathtaking hope. One of the ways we show that we have hope is by investing in something, whether it's investing our time, our money, or our gifts. In this stewardship season we are asking you to consider your investment in Peace. Your involvement shows that you have hope – hope in God, hope for the present and future of the church, and hope for your community. In this season we ask, how are you able to give out of hope? Pray about it, talk about it, and please return an intention card by April 6th. You are lights, you are hope, and we are so grateful that we get to be and do all this together with you for the sake of Christ.

Dear Members and Friends of Peace,

The last two months we have had large events that were made possible by Thrivent Action Team Grants. You might be asking yourself, what is a Thrivent Action Team Grant, and so I wanted to take a moment to explain this opportunity so that you can evaluate whether this is something you can be a part of. Thrivent Action Team Grants are available to anyone who has membership or associate membership with Thrivent Financial. Full Members may apply for 2 action team grants each year and associate members may apply for 1 each year.

An action team grant is \$250 of seed money for fundraisers, service projects, and education opportunities. Some events that we have used Thrivent Grants for are the Trunk-or-Treat, Scholarship Spaghetti Dinner, and Antioch. They are very easy to apply for and Pastor Amy and I are more than willing to help you fill out an application online for one. We realize that this is something that many of you may not know is even an option as a Thrivent Financial Member. What a wonderful resource to help make ministry possible. Due to our Thrivent Action Grant, we did not use any proceeds from the scholarship fundraiser to buy food. All the money raised from selling tickets went towards scholarships for college freshmen and seminarians. Thrivent helped us to buy non-candy toys for children who cannot have candy for Trunk or Treat. The youth at Antioch were able to get a special treat because of the action grant.

We hope that this opportunity gets your ministry ideas flowing! If you have an idea that you think would be a great way to use an action grant, please let us know. This can be a way to help support existing events and create new ones. Thank you for all you do to spread the good news!
