A Letter From Your Pastor

Pastor Amy Michelson

If you have ever owned a home, you may know what it's like to watch interest rates, hoping for a drop and a chance to refinance and lower your monthly payment. Peace also has a mortgage; however, our mortgage is not a fixed rate, but rather a 10-year ARM (adjustable-rate mortgage). This means that every 10 years, the rate resets and is then fixed for 10 years until it resets again.

The next mortgage reset (and hopefully, our last!) is coming up on March 15th, 2026. Mortgage resets always present an opportunity to try to pay off some of the remaining principal before the rate resets and your payment changes. The more principal you pay off, the lower your payment will be. The lower our mortgage payment, the more funds we have available to care for our aging building and to put toward our ministries that bring people in contact with the gospel and help them grow in their relationship to God in Christ.

If you would like to make a special gift toward paying off the principal of our mortgage, now would be a great time to do so. You can make a one-time gift online or place it in an envelope in the offering plate or mail it in. If you do, please designate it to "mortgage principal" so we know to apply it to the mortgage.

Thank you for all the ways you generously participate in the Body of Christ here in this place!

(PS: If you'd like to know more about our mortgage, here are some details – Current rate: 4.00%, Maturity date: 3/15/2031, however, we make an additional payment on principal each month, so we are hoping to pay off the mortgage around 4/2030, Current mortgage payable: \$299,705)

Poinsettia Tributes - Due by Sun., Dec. 1




Parents Day Out - Sun., Dec. 14
