A Letter From Your Pastor

The divisiveness in our nation does not seem to be getting any better. It's frustrating how entire groups of people are being made out to be the enemy. It's unholy the wars that rage in the structures of our government and in our own families and homes. It is not Christ-like to tear one another down, to call each other names, or to only care about the issues that affect our own personal lives and interests. (Romans 12:9-21)

In case you ever wonder, Peace is a purple congregation. I know this because many of you have shared your personal views on a variety of issues. You have told me who you've voted for, who you haven't voted for, and what party you are affiliated with and I haven't come across a single person at Peace who is evil. So, the next time you think about saying something ugly about the people on the other side of an issue from you, think about your siblings in Christ that gather each weekend to worship alongside you at Peace. Would you say it to them? I write this not from a holier-than-thou perspective, but, honestly, most of the things I preach and teach are because I need to be reminded of them too.

I don't have answers for this discouragingly divisive time. But I do have hopes. That we can still remain loving and kind to one another. That we can allow the Spirit to guide us. That we can continue to come together with less hatred and more humility in our hearts. That we can work together to feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, and care for those who are sick or in prison (Matthew 25:34-40). That we would choose to encourage one another and build one another up (see our everybody read passage). And that we would limit our exposure to the voices that choose to tear down instead of build up.

Life is hard enough. And I am grateful for this community of diverse perspectives who are trying to live our lives loving God and loving others.

Dear Members and Friends of Peace,

Being good stewards of our resources is central to who we are as Christians. One of the tools we have as Lutherans is a company called Thrivent. Thrivent Financial for Lutherans is an organization that helps with investing and saving, but also allows its members to give back to the organizations and programs they care about. Many of you are Thrivent members. If you use any of Thrivent's services or someone invested in your name you are considered a member.

I am working on a project to compile a list of those in our congregation and community that are Thrivent members. Why? Thrivent has a wonderful program called Thrivent Action Teams. With this program anyone who is a member can create an action team for a program or a cause that either has elements of service, education, or fundraising. We have used Action Teams here at Peace in several ways. We received an Action Grant for The Women's Retreat, Trunk or Treat, Our Community Dinners and even our VBS. Each Action Grant is given up to \$250 of seed money to buy supplies, food, or things like a jump house for our Community Dinners.

I need your help. If you are a Thrivent Financial for Lutherans member and would be willing to be added to the list of people willing to use their action grants at Peace, would you please let me know? If you are not sure if you are a member, just ask Pastor Amy or I, and we can help you find out. Each member can apply for 2 action grants every year. As you can imagine, that is a lot of money and support that we can use to serve, educate and fundraise. It also gives you the opportunity to support one of the ministries here that you care about. If you have a student who will be applying for a scholarship you could get an action grant for the spaghetti dinner. If you have a youth who will be going to the next National Youth Gathering you could get car wash supplies. If you really love the ministry, we do at Morning Star or Santa Cruz, you could get an action grant to buy the items on the list of needs.
