Since joining the museum in 1988, she has reinstalled the collections of Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, and 18th-century European paintings and sculptures three times and organized two major international exhibitions. She holds a graduate degree and doctorate from Washington University.

Based in the monastic tradition, Lectio Divina involves a slow contemplative praying of a Bible passage(s). It differs from Bible Study in that it is reading God's word more with the heart than the head. "Lectio divina," (literally "holy reading") begins with cultivating the ability to listen deeply, to hear "with the ear of our hearts" the words of Holy Scripture.

The Rev. Susie Skinner will lead the group in praying the scripture readings for the coming Sunday. The group will meet each Thursday morning through Lent, 2/19, 2/26, 3/5, 3/12 and 3/19, 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Elliot Room.


Fish Fry Friday

We'd love to see you there as we come together in friendship and faith!






