INVITATION TO THE TABLE

The Risen Christ is still among us. Calling us from routine activities, sometimes blind confusion, into the light of Christ.

Friends, this is Christ's table. We are the guests. He is the host. You need not be a member at Armstrong Chapel or even the United Methodist Church.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
