September 9 from 6:30-8:30pm at St Paul Community UMC, hosted by the City of Madeira Inclusion Committee

Dr. Melvin Gravely eloquently accomplishes what many have undoubtedly wished to do: talk openly to someone we know about race in the United States today. Gravely uses significant experience as a business and civic leader to express a rare balance in this timely message. His book and this presentation present an invitation to understand three questions at the heart

of the issue: What is really going on with race in our country? Why must we care? And what can we do about it together? In the end, Gravely calls on us to ask ourselves, "What is my role in all of this?"
