SCRIPTURE

Acts 10:34-43 (NRSVUE)

³⁴ Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality,³⁵ but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him.³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all.³⁷ That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced:³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.³⁹ We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree,⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear,⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead.⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

REMEMBERING OUR BAPTISMAL VOWS

All people stand in need of the grace that God alone can give. In our baptism, God acts to claim us as beloved children. God has chosen through the ministries of the church to provide the means of grace to everyone in Christian Baptism. The reaffirmation of this faith is made each time we witness the sacrament.

Baptism is the way to recall the gracious act of God by which we enter into Christ; we are raised to walk in newness of life; and become a member of the family of God.

Water is a symbol of the Holy Spirit and the life-transforming grace Christ alone supplies.

We are especially moved to hear the gospel call again, and are urged to renew our profession of faith—

I invite all who are baptized to join in the Reaffirmation of your Baptismal Covenant, responding as indicated:

Do you in the presence of God desire to reaffirm the covenant which you made or which was made for you at your baptism?

I do.

Do you renounce evil and seek to walk in the life of faith as a person who trusts in God alone for life, strength and salvation?

I do.

Do you believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, the Savior of the world; and do you declare him Lord of your life?

I do.

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Gracious God, we thank you that in every age you have made water a sign of your presence. In the beginning your Spirit brooded over the waters and they became the source of all creation. You led your people through the waters of the Red Sea to their new land of freedom and hope. In the waters of the Jordan, your Son was baptized by John and anointed with your Spirit for his ministry of reconciliation. May this same Spirit bless this water by which we

remember our baptisms today, that we may be refreshed and renewed to walk faithfully as your disciples—buried and raised in Christ, strengthened by His resurrection to rejoice in you. Defend all who present themselves before you with your heavenly grace, and confirm within them the presence of your Holy Spirit; for we pray in the name of Christ our Lord. Amen




