Answer: Learn how to think during seasons of division

I. People Who Had to Re-Build After Various Seasons of Division and Challenge

- 1. Moses had to rebuild after forty years of division (He focused on the future not his failure or the grievances of the past
 - (Exodus 2-14).
- **2. Elijah had to rebuild after managing divisions from Jezebel** (He lost focus and eventually retired after his divisive encounter with Jezebel)
 - (1 Kings 18-19).
- **3. Job had to rebuild after being tempted to feel divided or separated from God's favor** (He had to focus on trusting God during a profoundly confusing and hard to explain series of tragedies and disappointments.
 - (Job 1:18-19, Job1-42).
- **4. Jeremiah had to rebuild after watching his nation enslaved** (He had to focus after watching his nation lose their freedom)
 - (Jeremiah 29-31).
- **5. St. Paul had to fight through a racially divided culture** (He had to focus on God's plan to expose the racial divide and cultural and gender insensitivities)
 - (Acts1:17-18, Acts 9-28).





Conclusion:

- Our nation has and is going through a great divide. The good part is that we can now clearly see it. We must focus and rise above it.
- Are you busy judging someone else's biases and ignoring your own?
- Jesus said we all lose if we are divided, we cannot win divided (Matthew 12:25)
