Did you know that Deuteronomy means second law or repeated law....Moses spoke these words on the last day of his life. Deut 6:2, "Fear the Lord your God, you and your children and your children's children and as long as you live." Deuteronomy 6:6-7, "And you must commit yourselves wholeheartedly to these commands that I am giving you today. Repeat them again and again to our children. Talk about them when you are on the road, when you are going to bed, and when you are getting up." Repeat Repeat Repeat.....

Just as we are to keep the commandments, I feel we need to continue teaching the next generation about prayer. My question for all of us to ponder this February is, How Is Your Prayer Life?

STARS Wednesday After School Program for Kindergarten-5th Grade has continued our journey through the Bible. By Christmas, we made it through the Old Testament up to the time of Jesus' birth. Now we are learning about the incredible things Jesus taught and did during his ministry here on earth. We spend a little time singing each night, and a fun song the kids have been learning is "Go!", a song to help them memorize The Great Commission verses, Matthew 28:19-20.



For our Learning Activities during November, we built simple robots from Mars Rover Robotix Kits, loaned by Iowa State University Extension; learned about Veteran's Day and what it meant to be drafted, and made thank you gifts for veterans; and learned about life as a missionary from Teisa Nicole, whose husband Jean was the Marketplace Chaplain at Janco Industries here in Sully (Their family has since returned to the mission field in the Philippines.).

For the month of January, we have made snowmen out of jelly/fruit jars and filled the inside with homemade cocoa mix, with the help and some of the materials donated by Eleanor Jansen; Ruth Renaud came for two weeks and we had the challenge of learning macramé, with

each child making a water bottle holder; and this week we made seed pictures, which involved gluing corn, soybeans, sunflower seeds, etc. to a board cut into the shape of a cross.

Sometimes the sounds coming from the STARS rooms are pretty priceless, like this past week when you might have heard the Crew Leaders who gently said, "It looks like you have plenty of glue there now", the Bible Study Leader who gasped when she thought a Crew Leader had injuries to their hands, only to discover upon closer examination that it was a bunch of glue and seeds still stuck to their

We are able to say working at FRC is a blessing and coming to work each day is still fun! No day is the


same. We attribute this to having a great consistory and pastors and congregation that make it easy to work here.
