Pastor's Notes

February 2023: The Gift of Getting Ready... Again

I have a confession to make to you all — we've just put away our Christmas decorations. (Well, actually... there are still a few boxes that need to go out to the shed, but I'm waiting for the weather to warm up a bit!) What can I say? Getting "ready" for Christmas took so much time and preparation — it's hard now to make time to put Christmas "away."

So here we are, boxing up the last reminders of Christmastime – just in time for Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on Feb 22. Phew! That's a quick turnaround and it's hard to get into the spirit of the Lenten season when one is still spinning from Christmas.

But, as we know – the Christmas decorations and lights are not all there is; the spiritual, heart-work of Advent and Christmas is what's really important – and not something to be stuck in a box. The light of Christ is to be always visible and always present in our lives. As Linus says in that famous scene from a Charlie Brown Christmas: "*That's what Christmas is all about.*"

The journey of Lent, then, is a perfect continuation of what Christmas is all about; Lent leads us to the moment of why Jesus came in the first place – to the moment when God Incarnate was crucified, died... and then rose again on Easter. This is what the world had waited for – and this is the hope onto which we as Christians stake our faith.

But Lent takes hard work and commitment, too. We know it leads to Easter but we must not rush through Lent. Just as we may still be "cleaning house" of Christmas reminders, I want to encourage us to think of Lent as a time to clear out our spiritual houses. Lent is a time to ask ourselves – What is worth holding onto? What's weighing us down? And what's getting in the way of our relationship with God? What in our lives, frankly, needs to die to make room for the new life of Christ's resurrection?

That is the intention of the Lenten season for us: to face the stuff around us that we don't need – all the stuff we think has value – all the stuff we think may be worth keeping around or close by - stuff like:

- destructive behaviors and destructive indulgences
- patterns of negative thoughts toward others and yourself
- resentments and harsh feeling toward self and neighbor
- other "stuff" between you and God...

Lent calls us to a time of true discernment —and courage - to put the damaging stuff away for good and make room for the light of Christ's resurrection to come again and lift us up to new life with Him.

And so – let us receive Lent 2023 as an early Easter gift – and let us be open for true growth in Christ as we adorn the world with Easter's hope and joy fully on display in our lives.

The kids have had a great month of learning. One of the lessons from January was about choices. They read about Adam and Eve and discussed how God gives us
