

Well friends, the time has come. We are nearing the end of summer and getting ready for the fall months.

But why should the kids have all the fun? Shouldn't we all – at any age – be willing and open to learning new things – especially when it comes to our faith? This summer we've been exploring the extraordinary value of being Godfollowers. This fall – we're all going back to school!

Beginning in September, we'll be kicking off a new sermon series called **LESSON PLANS** - **Exploring the Extraordinary Teachings of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew**. This will be as it sounds: a week-to-week journey through Matthew's Gospel with a focus on Jesus's teachings – many of which can only be found in Matthew. These include several parables, on-the-street teachings, and the Sermon on the Mount. We've already looked at a bit of this teaching already – as we made our way line-by-line through the Lord's Prayer (found in Matt. 6).

We'll begin, though, at the very end of Matthew's Gospel – with what we know of as "The Great Commission." In this is found the essence of Matthew's entire Gospel. In here is described the life into which every Holy-Spirit- infused follower of Jesus has been taught to live - a life that takes us out of our comfort zones and bids us to participate fully in our faith in Christ. We will do so on September 10th when we gather in Taylor Hall at 10AM for worship and fellowship as we celebrate and get excited for new opportunities for our youth and our church as God keeps us moving forward together.

Nervous? Don't be. We all have a lot to learn! So, hold on tight! I promise it will be alright. Jesus, after all, promised to be with us "to the end of the age" – that is, with us every day as we learn from – and choose to follow – Him.

To get ready I encourage you to read Matthew's Gospel through to the end. See what you find. What questions do you have? I look forward to continuing this extraordinary season of learning with all of you!


