PASTOR NOTES FOR SUMMER 2024: A SUMMER OF INSPIRATION

This Summer we have embarked on a series called **SPIRIT INSPIRED!** in which we are looking at the many ways the Holy Spirit is present with us when we worship. We've said that worship is a lifestyle – something we are actively called to participate in. Christian Worship may be defined simply as one giving "all glory and honor, praise and Thanksgiving to the holy triune God." Worship then is not confined to an hour-long weekly church service – but rather, it may happen anywhere and anytime. However – it's still a VERY good thing to come to church on Sundays!

We gather in a worship service as a response to the God who loved us so much that he gave his only son Jesus...and the Holy Spirit is the one who "gathers us for worship and who calls us together to enlighten and equip us through the word of God - giving us gifts for ministry in the church and mission in the world" - to further and deepen our response to God's love.

So, this summer we are looking at all the "parts" of our worship services (called the "Liturgy") – from beginning to end – with hope that by the end of the series we will all have a greater sense of the presence and the direction of the Holy Spirit in worship – and a deeper appreciation for the way we worship here at Buckingham. So far at this writing – we've looked at three important "parts" of worship together:

- 1. LITURGY: We looked at the structure of our service as a whole and defined "liturgy" as "the work of the people." Worship is not something done for us or around us; rather we called to engage in the work together. A church service is our weekly practice session for the work then that we are called to do in the world as followers of Jesus Christ.
- 2. CALL TO WORSHIP: We looked at the "call to worship" which is really an invitation to give our full attention to God in worship. It is also a reminder (right at the beginning of worship) of our call to go and invite others to come and join us in the action of the being the church.
- 3. PRAYER: We also looked at the hand-in-hand relationship between worship and prayer, defined for us as "the heart of worship" and "the primary way in which we participate in worship." We named several types of prayer, namely corporate (using words), silent (prayed in quiet) and the all-important confessional prayer in which we stand in grace together.

This is where we've already been, friends – and the best is yet to come! We will be looking at the importance of the scriptures (both read and preached), the sacraments (Baptism and Holy Communion), the use of Creeds and the Offering. All of which are Spirit-inspired parts of our liturgy.

And OF COURSE there is MUSIC! Details to come on a special evening outdoor service CELEBRATING MUSIC and the many ways the Spirit sings to us and through us when we worship God through it.

Tentative date and time: Sunday, July 28 - 6PM. Stay tuned! (Ha Ha - get it?)

DON'T FORGET to let your Burning Questions about and all aspects of worship be known. Feel free to bring them to worship – or get in touch with me and I'll do my best to answer them. This is a time for learning together. On that note – also remember you can always come on a Thursday night to meet with our BPC Scholars group at 6 o'clock - where the conversation and questions continue to flow.


