# THE ESSENTIAL NEED FOR A GOOD "PAIR OF CLEATS"

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. - Acts 2: 1-4

A few years ago, when still living in upstate New York, I had a chance to visit the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown. Although I am not a die-hard baseball fan, I absolutely loved it – the displays, the plaques, all the great history of America's game.

My favorite displays are the wooden statues of Babe Ruth and Ted Williams. The details on these works of art are amazing - from their team caps down to their shining metal cleats. The descriptions of the statues make it clear, though – these statues are made entirely from wood – there's no cloth, no metal, no leather, no stitching – they are 100% wood and paint.

These carvings are so life-like! I half expected them to come to life – as if some magical baseball cap may fall from the sky onto their heads (like in the Christmas cartoon "Frosty the Snowman" when the magic top hat lands on Frosty's head and he suddenly springs to life and says: "Happy Birthday!") I wish but alas – these statues will remain wooden likenesses – from the caps to each shiny pair of cleats leaving us to only remember and imagine the life of these two greats.

On June 8, the church will celebrate Pentecost – again saying "happy birthday" to the church. The church came to life by the coming of the promised Holy Spirit – bringing life to the community of faith and every one of Christ's followers.

The Holy Spirit is called the "Paraclete" – the Spirit of Truth who cleaves to us and gives us courage to show and tell others about the truth we believe about the love and power of Jesus Christ. The mission of the church is and has always been to give testimony to this truth – in word and deed – and to stand firm in the power of the Holy Spirit while standing in awe of the many ways the Holy Spirit works in and through us - and makes itself known in people we may never have dreamed possible.




