In addition to summer reading, each high school class is assigned a writing component to support comprehension and critical thinking.

For the novel **The Screwtape Letters** by C.S. Lewis, 12th graders will be completing a quote analysis over the summer on demonic strategies proposed by the senior demon, Screwtape. As you read the novel, find 20 demonic strategies from different chapters, record the strategy, record the quote that supports it (with citation) and briefly explain how this strategy can lead a person into sin and bondage. Please make sure you use citation for your quote - a Works Cited page is not necessary. When we return in September, we will complete an in-depth overview and analysis of the entire novel.

This book is a collection of letters written from a senior demon (Screwtape) to his inexperienced nephew (Wormwood) regarding the best ways to secure the soul of an unsuspecting young man. The letters span a wide variety of topics and focus on the temptations and deceitful strategies used within the demonic realm to pull us away from God's truth.
