# UNDIVIDED MATTHEW 6:19-24 10/15/23

## I. TWO TREASURES

Matthew 6:19-21 - "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, <sup>20</sup> but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. <sup>21</sup> For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

- 1. Jesus exposes the durability of our treasure
  - ~ Earthly Treasure: Temporary and unprotected
  - Heavenly Treasure: Eternal and Protected
- 2. Our hearts will follow our treasure either up to Heaven or down to earth

#### II. TWO EYES

Matthew 6:22-23 - "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, <sup>23</sup> but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!"

- 1. Jesus exposes the healthiness of our focus
- 2. Healthy eyes help us see and perceive the true nature of things
  - Unhealthy eyes leave us blind to disaster

# III. TWO MASTERS

Matthew 6:24 - "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money."

- 1. Jesus exposes the singularity of our love
- 2. Jesus argues from external to internal
- 3. Love for God may look like hatred for the world
