"I wonder as I wander, out under the sky, how Jesus the Savior did come for to die for poor ordinary people like you and like I; I wonder as I wander, out under the sky." This theme and variations is arranged by contemporary Korean American composer Marianne Kim. The Huron Carol is an old Canadian carol dating to the 1600s; it relates the story of Jesus' birth in the terms of First Nations, or indigenous, culture. You can read the English text in our hymnal at number 244. This arrangement is by contemporary New York-based composer Alfred V. Fedak.
