"On Christmas night all Christians sing to hear the news the angels bring." The Ukrainian Carol, also called "The Carol of the Bells," is based on the traditional Ukrainian song "Shchedryk." It is attributed to Ukrainian composer Mykola Leontovych in 1914. These organ arrangements are by contemporary American composer Alfred V. Fedak.



"Canticle of the Turning" is a contemporary paraphrase of Mary's words in Luke 1:46-55, which echo earlier prophetic songs from the Old Testament. The hymn uses an Irish folk song for an upbeat, lively setting of Mary's song, full of hope and determination.
