THIRSTY

I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed Me... Matthew 25:35 ESV

I love this Bible passage! To me, it embodies what the church, our faith families, should look like to the world... Hospitality. And not just hospitality, but spiritual hospitality. Caring that serves the physical needs and worldly needs, even as it addresses the spiritual food—the spiritual thirst—that accompanies the obvious needs.

How aware are we of the thirsty around us? How eager are we to share the spiritual water that God gives us freely in His Word—that thirst-quenching water revealed in the Bible? Do we share our joy indiscriminately with anyone around us? Or do we save

it for only our friends or those we already know? Does an easy smile or a quick hug come naturally? This may be exactly the living water that someone else is missing in his or her life. Let's not be stingy with our joy and the Word that feeds that joy.


In the first Christian churches, worshippers were encouraged to "greet each other with a holy kiss," a type of trust-giving. In a world often marked by division, the call to greet one another warmly challenges us to overcome barriers and foster genuine relationships within the church. Let's consider how we can show love and unity in our church communities; whether through a handshake, a hug, or simply a warm greeting with a smile.

The call to bring water to the thirsty is our Lord's way of pulling down barriers that could separate us from the spiritual water we ourselves need, and that we need to share with others.

Don't be stingy! Share the water of life that's spelled out in the Bible. Share your joy that Jesus has provided with that free gift of life-giving spiritual water whenever and wherever God gives you opportunity.

DRY ME!

"You don't drink enough water." My dear wife reminds me of that often, and it has shown up in a couple medical issues of late. Now, we have a son who is a physician's assistant, and he can tell me what I'm missing medically and physically because of my lack of H2O intake. But I can feel it. At least at times. Maybe you know what that lack of life-giving fluid can do to you. I'm learning how to catch it, so I am doing better. Drink up. It's good for you.

Water is used a lot in the Bible to refer to God Himself, to refer to the effects of receiving God's Word, and to describe the life given to us by taking that all in. Not too long ago I wrote somewhere about Jesus promising lifegiving water as He spoke in the temple in John 7. "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. Whoever believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." You'll find that in verses 37-38



I can't force anyone to drink enough water for their own good. And clearly, no one can get that message through my thick head. Something else must click. And it must click in me. Zero in on Jesus' words at the beginning of the text above, "If anyone thirsts." Did you get that? Jesus is depending on us to feel our need, our lack of what only He can give. And that's where being filled begins. God is already willing and

desiring to give His gifts and He never puts obstacles in the way. He may even, and most certainly does, give us much needed gifts even when our desire is low. But here is the important portion of this truth: we will never *gain* all that God wants us to have without desiring it. It is God's water given to one who *thirsts for it* that produces our realization of what God has given. Then, and only then, will our praise to God abound properly in return.

You know what? I'm thirsty.



THE CIRCLE SERIES BLACK/RED/WHITE

Three novels. Two worlds. One story. Enter an adrenaline-laced epic where dreams and reality collide.


Black—An incredible story of evil and rescue, betrayal and love, and a terrorist threat unlike anything the human race has ever known. A virulent evil has been unleashed upon the people of Earth. The only man who can stop it is Thomas Hunter, an unlikely hero whose life is stretched between

two worlds. Every time he falls asleep in one reality, he awakes in the other.

Soon Thomas no longer knows which reality is real. Yet it quickly becomes apparent that his choices in each world impact the other—and that the fates of both rest in his hands.

Red—In one world, Thomas Hunter is a battle-scarred general commanding an army of primitive warriors. In the other, he's racing to outwit sadistic terrorists' intent on creating global chaos through an unstoppable virus. Thomas must find a way to change history—or face the destruction of two worlds.

White—Thomas Hunter has only days to survive two separate realms of danger, deceit, and destruction. The



fates of both worlds now rest on his unique ability to shift realities through his dreams. Thomas and The Circle must quickly decide who they can trust—both with their own lives and the fate of millions of others.

And neither the terror of Black nor the treachery of Red can prepare Thomas for the forces aligned against The Circle in White.

Beautiful artwork graces this 3-in-1 graphic novel. A great plot from Ted Dekker, one of the modern greats in Christian allegories and storytelling prowess, makes for a fantastic reading experience. This graphic novel is available in the Redeemer library, as are the three full-length regular novels by

Dekker, of this same series. Also available is the fourth in the series— GREEN. Check them out!


THIRST-QUENCHING PATH: REFRESHMENT FOR THE JOURNEY
