ACTIVITIES

- Set Apart-Play "one of these things is not like the others" with four items in each set (e.g. toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, and a pencil). Set apart the item that is unlike the rest. Do this with a few sets. Talk about what it means to be set apart for God and why we should be set apart.
- 2. **Filled With Good**-Fill a cup with something good (juice, milkshake, etc.) then fill a second cup with something bad (vinegar, etc.) Smell and taste both. Talk about the contrast of being filled with good and bad. Read Colossians 3:16. How can we let God fill us with good?
- 3. Jesus Grew, We Grow Too-Make a growth chart (or if you already have one, make sure to update how everyone has grown physically while reading Luke 2:52. Talk about how Jesus grew and became filled with wisdom. What are some ways we can gain wisdom to grow in ways other than physically?
